The powwow typically occurs in the summer months, and it brings together members of the Mississaugas of Scugog Island First Nation and other Indigenous communities from across Canada and the United States.

The powwow features a variety of traditional Indigenous ceremonies, dances, and songs, and it is an opportunity for Indigenous people to come together to honor their cultural traditions and to share them with others. The powwow often includes a Grand Entry, where participants enter the powwow grounds in a colorful procession led by the Eagle Staff and flags.

ODEWE'IGANI

DRUM SPONSOR

The drum is an important item in Ojibwe culture. They are used in ceremonies, powwows, and social gatherings as a tool for communication, healing, and prayer. They are understood to have the power to connect people with the spirit world. The drum is considered to be a living item with a spirit and are often adorned with traditional Ojibwe designs and symbols.



MIINIGOOZIWIN

HONOURARIA SPONSOR

Giveaways are a foundational aspect of Indigenous generosity. They are acknowledgments of appreciation to recipients to honour their contributions to the gathering or celebration. A measure of wealth, from an Indigenous perspective, is how much you are able to give rather than how much you have accumulated. This custom has endured to modern times.



ASHANGED

FOOD SPONSOR
\$10,000

The importance of sharing food amongst tribal members is foundational to Ojibwe culture. Our ancestral connection to the land gave us an unparalleled reverence for the natural world and the bounty it provides. Ensuring our guests are fed and looked after is paramount when hosting traditional gatherings and ceremonies.



NIIMIKAAGED

DANCE SPECIAL SPONSOR

Traditional dances are an important part of Ojibwe culture and are often performed at ceremonies, powwows, and other social gatherings. The act of dancing is seen as a way of expressing one's connection to the natural world, honoring one's ancestors and community, and celebrating life. They are a means of individual expression of spirit through movement.



MASHKIKI

MEDICINE SPONSOR
\$5,000

Medicine is a very important aspect of Ojibwe culture, and refers not only to physical healing but also to spiritual, emotional, and mental wellness. In Ojibwe culture, everything in the natural world is seen as interconnected and imbued with spiritual power and wellness. Plants, animals, and other elements of nature are viewed as having unique healing properties, and are used in traditional medicine practices.



GWAABA'IBII

WATER SPONSOR
\$2,500

Water is a very important element in Ojibwe culture and is seen as a sacred and life-giving force. It plays a central role in Indigenous ideology and emphasizes the importance of protecting and respecting water. We believe that the spirit of life exists in water and without water, no life could exist. Water has consciousness and it is important for people to maintain and strengthen our relationship with water.



NAGAMOWIN

SINGING SPECIAL SPONSOR

Singing is often used as a way to connect with the natural world, express gratitude, honor ancestors and cultural traditions, and promote healing and wellness. Songs are typically accompanied by drumming and are often performed in groups, with each person contributing to the overall sound and rhythm. Traditionally, songs may have specific purposes, such as healing, prayer, or storytelling, and many are passed down through generations as a way of preserving cultural traditions and knowledge.
